Residential Burglary Arrest 2013-20198

On 11-09-13 at 8:46 pm Paradise Valley Police Officers responded to a welfare check in the 6800 block of E. Valley Vista Lane. Officers arrived and spoke with the complainant who stated her son, Ryan Joseph Proper D.O.B. 04-25-90 had text messaged her and expressed concern for her ex-husband who resides at the Valley Vista address. The complainant also stated she is the victim in the recent Calle Bruvira burglary #2013-20187 and suspects that her son is responsible for that crime.

The complainant then called Proper on his cell phone and Proper stated he was inside the Valley Vista residence. Proper was directed to come out, and was detained for further investigation. Officers then conducted a search of the residence to check the welfare of Proper's father, but no other subjects were located at the residence.

Officers then Mirandized Proper and questioned him about the burglaries. Proper admitted to committing the Calle Bruvira burglary. He also admitted he had entered the Valley Vista residence without permission. Officers were able to locate Proper's father who confirmed Proper was not allowed at the residence and stated he would aid in the prosecution of Proper for burglary. Proper was transported to the Maricopa County Jail where he was booked on burglary charges related to both these crimes.

Frequently the Police Department takes burglary and theft reports where the suspect is an estranged family member. If you have a situation where a family member is a danger to you, or should not be allowed at your home, we encourage you to contact the Paradise Valley Magistrate Court and file an Order of Protection. This order will make it a crime for the restrained party to be at your residence and will allow the Officers to arrest them for being there whether or not they have committed another crime. To inquire further please contact the court. They are currently located at the Police Department 6433 E. Lincoln Dr. in Paradise Valley.

You should always lock your doors and windows and set your alarm when you are away from home. The Paradise Valley Police Department offers free crime prevention surveys and help in setting up Neighborhood Block Watch groups.
