Residential Burglary 2014-2606

On 02-06-14 at approximately 12:36 p.m. a resident in the 4700 block of E. Arroyo Verde Dr. heard their doorbell ring, and a few moments later glass break to the rear of their residence. They then went to the front of their home and confronted a white male in a black Ford heavy duty pickup who was in their driveway. There was a female juvenile in the front seat of the pickup. When confronted by the resident the suspect said the person who broke the glass had just left. The suspect then fled the area. Paradise Valley Police Officers responded and checked the area but the suspect was not located.

Residential Burglary 2014-2625

On 02-06-14 at approximately 2:07 p.m. Safeguard Security responded to a monitored alarm in the 4600 block of E. Quartz Mountain Rd. Upon arrival they found a garage service door that had been forced open. Paradise Valley Police Officers responded and checked the residence and area but no suspects were located.

Criminal Trespass 2014-2627

On 02-06-14 at approximately 2:24 p.m. a resident returned home in the 6100 block of E. Mountain View Rd. to find a white male in their backyard looking through a sliding glass door. The suspect stated he was looking for a lost dog, and then fled the area in a white newer SUV (possibly a Cadillac Escalade) with a temporary Arizona registration. The suspect was described as being in his early 20s, 5'10" – 6'0" tall, dark hair, wearing a backpack. Paradise Valley Police Officers responded and checked the area but no suspects were located.
