### Weekend Burglaries & Thefts

Between the late evening hours of October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 and early morning hours of October 2<sup>nd</sup>, several residents fell victim to thieves who entered vehicles and garages in the south-east portion of the Town. Paradise Valley Police responded to a total of four (4) calls for service which resulted in the reporting of 1 stolen vehicle, one garage burglary and 4 vehicle burglaries.

In one of the vehicle burglaries, computer equipment, financial documents and sunglasses were removed. In another, clothing and cigars were taken. In a third a pair of sunglasses was taken and in the fourth vehicle burglary, the victim's purse was taken. The purse was later located after it was discarded. Sunglasses and cash were missing. It is believed that all of the vehicles were left unlocked when they were entered.


One of the vehicles was entered as it sat in an unsecured garage that had its overhead door open. Also taken from the garage was an adult bicycle, black with oversized white tires (photo is attached).

The vehicle that was reported stolen was a silver 2010 Honda CRV bearing Arizona registration BNY2097.

It is extremely important that residents secure their property by removing all valuables from their vehicles, lock car doors and activate the alarm and double check garage doors to ensure they are closed when not in the garage. Do your part in making Paradise Valley less desirable to thieves and other criminals.
