Stalking Arrest 2018-15569



Jacqueline Ades, 31 of Phoenix, AZ

Paradise Valley's Criminal Investigations Unit arrested Jacqueline Ades of Phoenix on May 8th after conducting an investigation into her repeated contact with a Town resident. Documented incidents began in July of 2017 when Ades was found parked in front of the victim's residence. The victim was reporting that Ades was continually texting him after he advised her that he wanted no more contact with her. Police trespassed her

from the property and sent her on her way. Shortly there after, the victim began receiving threatening texts from Ades. In December of 2017, another report was received that Ades had returned to the residence, however police were unable to locate her. On April 8, 2018 the resident called stating that he was out of the country and was checking his home surveillance video and observed Ades in his home. When officers arrived, they found Ades in the residence taking a bath. She was taken into custody and charged with trespass to a residence, a felony. Ades was released after her initial appearance and given a court date. Ades then began sending threatening text messages to the victim indicating that harm may come to him.

On May 4, 2018 Scottsdale Police were called to a business for a woman who was out front acting irrationally and claiming to be the wife of the owner. Ades was contacted by Scottsdale Police at which time she advised the officer that she was married to the owner, who is the victim in the residential trespass case in Paradise Valley. Ades was trespassed from the business.

When Paradise Valley CIU learned of the Scottsdale contact they began searching for Ades. On May 8th, she was located and taken into custody without incident. Charges of Threatening and Intimidating, Stalking (both felonies), and Harassment (a misdemeanor) were filed against Ades. She was also booked into 4th Ave. Jail on a Failure to Appear warrant after she failed to show up for her court date on the original trespass case.
