The ACOPS meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 23, 2018 at the Paradise Valley Police Auditorium, 6433 E. Lincoln Drive.

ACOPS Committee Members in attendance: Chair Julie Pace, Ryan Wooddy, Paul Moore, Jay Ozer and Richard Post. In addition, ad hoc member Chuck Matthews attended. And, Chief Peter Wingert and Officer Steven McGhee were in attendance.

1. Chief Wingert reviewed the Strategic Plan developed in 2015.
 - (a) The Highlights of accomplishments at the 2-year mark:
 - (i) 82% of goals in the 5 year plan are complete
 - (ii) 11% of been started but not complete
 - (iii) 7% of Goals have not been started
2. Chief Wingert then discussed the next steps and update of the goals
 - (i) See the attachment for the Chief's Strategic Plan Update
3. The Houses of Worship Floor plan collection status was discussed
 - (i) Major progress has been made and only 6 churches still have not replied
 - (ii) The non replies were divided up and assigned to members to follow up
 - (iii) Discussion about starting a meeting two times a year with Town and House of Worship (similar to Mayors HOA Forum). This

could be coordinated through Tim Gomez at Town. Julie to talk to Mayor.

4. False Alarm Reduction
 - (i) A lot of work and research has been done by the Chief and the Committee
 - (ii) Next step is to develop an RFP for companies interested in working with the Town.
 - (iii) This program will move forward after the PV alarm program proposal gets approved by the Town Council.
5. Construction Security Discussion
 - (i) A flyer is being designed to handout to construction permit seekers to remind them of procedures for security that they should consider
6. The Committee discussed the possibility of establishing a charitable organization to accept donations to support police department needs. Chuck will provide some examples of organizations established for other law enforcement entities and work with Julie and the Chief on the documentation.

Chief Wingert outlined the various outreach programs that have been planned:

1. IRS Tax Scam Class will we schedule for a date in March
2. A water safety class has been scheduled for 4/26/18 in partnership with the YMCA
3. A discussion was held on CPR classes and it was determined that a partnership with Scottsdale Fire Department made the most sense
 - (i) They have classes scheduled for 4/7/18 & 5/5/18 that are open to everyone at 8401 E. Indian School Road. Register online or at 480-312-7957
 - (ii) Need to publicize these classes

Other outreach programs held or scheduled were discussed and Council or ACOPS members are welcome to attend:

1. First Wednesday monthly, Coffee with the Chief at 7:30 am
2. Blue Wednesday-Police lunch with school children
3. Volunteer Training-Driving test 1/20 & 21st
4. Volunteer Appreciation breakfast 1/24/18
5. Spring Shred-A-Thon- March 31, 2018
6. Guardian Games- Special Olympics- April 13, 2018

7. YMCA-Safety Around Water- April 26, 2018
8. Over the Edge-December 8, 2018
9. Cybercrime/Computer scams presentation will be scheduled for October or November 2018 – Chuck Matthews
10. Hazardous Waste collection is on hold until the trash collection issue is determined

Three safety articles were published concerning drones, sharing the road: bicycles, pedestrians and vehicles, and use of helicopters in town

There was a discussion of the bike issue in town and the possibility of posting some “sharing the road” signs on major arteries.

ACOPS vacancies. There was consensus that the Town Council should be responsible for interviewing candidates and filling the vacant positions
